


Your Face." Those are great titles and the lyrics do not disappoint. They have rhythm, rhyme and evoke intense feelings.

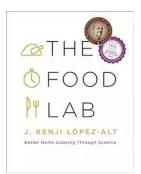

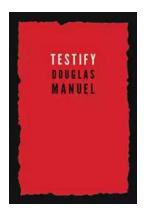
